We use mobile phone apps for online shopping, banking, social media, theatre tickets and even food delivery... so what better way to provide our customers with easy access to our data protection laws and guidance than to develop our very own. We're excited as at the time of writing this submission we are waiting for our Jersey Office of the Information Commissioner (JOIC) Resource App to be released from the App store.

Figures suggest a staggering 400,000 apps are being downloaded every minute of every day. With both our private and business lives being increasingly lived 'online' we believe data protection needs to be

We have developed the JOIC Resource App to better engage with the Jersey public and organisations to provide them with the easiest possible experience when accessing resources and guidance about our data protection laws and their relationship with the GDPR. We are proud that the critical function of the App is to facilitate an offline GDPR article reference with a bookmarking facility that allows users to save relevant articles for future use.

Our App details information about the technical elements of our local laws compared with the GDPR. The user has the opportunity to click on the Data Protection (Jersey) Law 2018 articles and schedules then to explore the associated part of the GDPR or the recitals and our guidance, to provide a full data protection experience. The guidance material is held on our dynamic website [www.jerseyoic.org](http://www.jerseyoic.org).

We believe we are the first regulator to launch a mobile app. Accessible on all hand held and mobile devices, it was developed by a specialist team on a coding programme at Digital Jersey ([www.digital.je](http://www.digital.je)), our Island's government-backed economic development agency and industry body dedicated to the growth and attraction of Jersey's digital sector on the international stage. It has been refined, tested and improved by our technical support team since its initial design.

Our app was designed to add value to our existing online platform [www.jerseyoic.org](http://www.jerseyoic.org), improve accessibility and increase customer engagement. We also hope it will improve the overall experience for our customers.

We believe we are the first regulator to launch a mobile app to bring data protection into the everyday lives of Islanders and this deserves recognition because;

- The critical function of the App is to facilitate offline GDPR article references with a bookmarking facility that allows users to save relevant articles for future use.
- The App reinforces the message that compliance, privacy and the law is important to everyone.
- It has the capacity to grow, add more content and tools, to develop content to meet user demands and queries.
- It enhances the visibility and accessibility of data protection, privacy and practical support all in a one stop shop resource.
- We plan to continually develop the app creation to meet user demands and queries. Our aim is to create a sibling app to complement the work of our Young Privacy Ambassador Programme.
- Using a familiar platform which is embedded in our everyday lives shows the JOIC as relevant to the digital era, while also demonstrating our commitment to being more visible and accessible.
